Justification & Draft proposal

Proposal for effective utilization of surplus funds with IVS

Introduction: As you may be aware, IVS earns a few Lakh rupees per annum by conducting vacuum courses, symposia/advertisements, etc. Previously, the earnings were earmarked as 'Building Fund' for the purchase of an office premises. This has been completed and IVS now owns an office space in the nearby Deonar area. At present, the surplus funds (annual earnings above expenditure) with IVS are being accumulated as savings without any plan as to what the surplus funds will be utilized for. Hence, a proposal for effective utilization of surplus funds with IVS is being put forward for the approval of the General Body.

Proposal: To provide funding to mainly Ph.D. students (maybe some Post Docs/University teachers, etc) to attend conferences/symposia with some relevance to vacuum technology and registration fee waiver for needy students wanting to attend IVS sponsored courses.

Detailed plan: A percentage of surplus funds left over from the previous financial year will be utilized for the above mentioned purpose as detailed below.

For attending local conferences: IVS may provide III AC return-fare, registration fee, accommodation charges (upto Rs 500 per day) and DA (Rs 100 per day as food is free in most of the conferences). Typical expenses could be of the order of Rs. 5000 /- per person.

For attending foreign conferences: Upto Rs 50,000/- may be given for attending an international conference (for travel/registration or stay etc). One or more persons could be supported per year depending on the availability of funds for the year.

Method of approval: Wide publicity will be given regarding this plan in our Website and other conferences. Applications received for funding will be scrutinized and may be approved by Secretary, IVS, immediately, if the amount is below Rs.10,000/-. For higher amounts the application will be referred to the Executive Committee and may be approved in regular monthly meetings. Bills and receipts submitted for this purpose shall be accounted in IVS monthly accounts statements.

Why this plan: Providing funding for attending conferences/symposia etc., for students and PhD guides in Universities and National Institutes will directly benefit IVS in terms of enhanced visibility and improve general awareness about IVS. Industry and others also may be more willing to support activities of IVS if we show a direct purpose. Registration fee waiver for IVS courses is in line with IVS's principles of propagating vacuum technology and applications to users across the country. In general, IVS providing scholarship for needy students enhances the growth of Vacuum Technology and will improve overall awareness of IVS activities.

The proposal is placed before the august body for approval.

MINUTES OF 38TH ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING:

The 38th AGBM of Indian Vacuum Society was held in Chanakya Hall, Hotel Abbott, Sector-2 Vashi, Navi Mumbai on July 17, 2010 at 1800 hrs. As there was no quorum at 1800 hrs, the meeting was adjourned for half an hour and the adjourned meeting was reconvened at 1830 hrs. Total 26 members were present during the meeting. Dr K.C. Mittal, President IVS presided over the meeting. Shri R.K. Mishra and Shri A.M. Kasbekar were requested to record the minutes of meeting and both agreed for the same. The President, Dr K.C. Mittal welcomed the members and requested General Secretary, Shri T.K.Saha to proceed with the AGBM Agenda.

Minutes of Last AGBM: Shri T.K.Saha read out the minutes of 37th AGBM held at Multipurpose Hall, Training School Hostel, Anushaktinagar, Mumbai-400094 on Aug 13, 2009. There was no query and corrections; the minutes were confirmed and approved as proposed by Shri A.V. Korgaonkar and seconded by Dr. V.C. Sahni.

Annual Report: The general Secretary, Shri T.K.Saha read out the Annual Report of 2009-2010. On a query raised by Shri Korgaonkar regarding allotment of Life membership number for new members, Shri Saha clarified that new membership numbers are issued in continuation and life membership numbers of deceased members remains abandoned. The typographic mistake in the annual report for name of the book was pointed out by the members, the same was accepted and agreed to correct. Dr. Sahni suggested encouraging active participation of vacuum product manufacturers & marketing associates and to explore possibilities of expanding its activities for mutual benefits. Dr Mittal clarified that IVS is committed to take along all the groups and said that the efforts were made in last couple of symposiums where industrial participation was encouraging and also said that next event is being planned at Hyderabad where large industrial units are likely to participate. Shri A. V. Korgaonkar raised query regarding status of Young Scientist Award. Shri Mr. T. K. Saha responded to it and informed the general body that this award was not conferred to any one for lack of suitable nomination. As there were no more questions, the annual report was accepted unanimously after recording typographic errors. Shri Jagannath proposed and Shri R.K. Mishra seconded the confirmation of the report.

Statement of Account: Dr Mittal requested treasurer, Shri K.A. Jadhav to present the statement of accounts. As the statement is self explanatory, members deliberated on the expenditure and income issues. Against a query regarding final payment to office premise builder, it was clarified that the occupation certificate for the building is received and final amount of Rs. 2.74 lacs has been paid in two installments of Rs. 1.74 lacs in the current financial year and rest Rs. 1 Lac in the financial year 2010-11. In response to Dr Ray's query regarding cash balance in the society accounts, the treasurer informed general body that the total FD in State Bank of India, BARC Branch and MDCC bank is about Rs. 16 lacs. Shri Korgaonkar suggested transferring surplus fund to building renovation fund so that income tax liability could be reduced to some extent. Dr Mittal sought permission of the general body to approve the proposal; general body approved the proposal by voice vote. During discussions, Dr. A.K. Ray suggested that statement of accounts could be sent well in advance to the members whose e-mail ID's are available. After few other minor clarifications, the statement of account was accepted by the members. The motion for approval of account was proposed by Shri Jagannath and seconded by Shri V. Nataraju.

Appointing of Statutory Auditor: Shri Saha informed general body that the present auditor, Mr. S.V. Mauskar, is growing old and due to his frequent visits to his family abroad, he is unable to do justice to the job. He is reluctant to continue as statutory auditor; hence it is high time to change the statutory auditor. Shri Saha proposed that a new auditor, Mr. Lalit M. Dhing may be appointed who has given written consent and ready to accept appointment of statutory auditor's assignment at the same remuneration (Rs. 3000/- per year) fixed by last AGBM. After brief deliberations, the general body approved the appointment of Mr. Lalit M. Dhing as statutory auditor of the society unanimously at the annual remuneration of Rs. 3000/- per year. The motion was proposed by Dr. Suresh Kumar and Dr. S.B. War seconded it.

Change of Society's office address to newly acquired premises: To this effect, the general secretary, Shri Saha read resolution passed by EC that the society's existing registered address as TPPED, BARC, Mumbai-400085 be changed to 302, Mahinder Chambers, 619/28, W.T. Patil Marg, Deonar, Chembur, Mumbai-400 071. The General body approved the resolution unanimously.

The resolution for amendment in society bye-laws regarding change in registered address was proposed by Shri V. Nataraju and seconded by Shri R.K. Sharma. The secretary also informed the GB about the typographical error in the notice where 304 is wrongly mentioned in place of 302.

To this effect, the general secretary, Shri Saha read resolution passed by EC that in view of the increasing cost of stationery, services and as the subscription was not revised for last 10 years, the Annual Membership, Life Membership and associate membership of the society may be increased with effect from 1 April 2011 as per following table.

Any other Matter: Dr. Sahni proposed to expand the activities of IVS by approaching other industries located at various zones in the country in general. He emphasized to contact industries at Gujarat, in particular, which are expected to give good response to such move. He also suggested establishing contacts with similar International forums. Dr Mittal appreciated the suggestions.

Shri V. Nataraju proposed to put all the members' details on website to which Shri R.K. Mishra suggested that this should be done but access should be restricted to members only.

Shri E. Kandaswamy suggested stopping printing hard copies of IVS bulletin and start circulating it as softcopy through emails. Members deliberated and the concluded that the publication of bulletin is a creditable activity and is a source of active communication among members particular for old members who are not internet savvy. However, it was agreed to explore the possibility of putting bulletins on IVS web-site as additional activity and give access to members through a password.

Shri A. M. Kasbekar suggested providing web-links to vendor website / addresses on IVS website to get some additional advertising income.

With this AGBM was declared closed and all the members were invited for dinner.
